**PLEASE NOTE:** According to Maryland law, the order of candidates on the ballot is determined first by the party of the governor, then by the principal minority party, then other minority parties in descending order based on statewide party registration. The order of listing in this Voters Guide follows that directive.

## The Presidential Election

### THE ELECTORAL COLLEGE

The selection of the President and Vice President of the United States is more complicated than counting up the number of votes that each candidate receives on Election Day. When the United States Constitution was written, the country's founders created an institution called our "Electoral College." Part of the goal of establishing such an institution was to give power to the less populous states and to ensure that candidates had sufficient distribution of votes from all areas of the nation to govern.

Each state is allocated one elector for every representative it has in Congress. In Maryland, we have two Senators and eight members of the House of Representatives so we have ten electors in the Electoral College. The smallest states have two senators and one member in the House so they have three electors. California, the most populous state, has 55 electors. The Electoral College includes 535 electors (one for every member in Congress plus three from the District of Columbia).

At one time, the electors' names appeared on the ballot during a Presidential election. Now, only the names of the candidates appear. However, voters are actually casting ballots for electors who are pledged to their ticket. The candidate with the highest number of votes in each state will be represented by electors who will all cast their vote for the winning candidate. The exceptions to the "winner take all" practice are Maine and Nebraska. In those states, the winner of the statewide vote gets two electoral votes (equal to the number of senators from that state) and the candidate with the highest popular vote in each Congressional District receives the one electoral vote that is allocated for that district.

On the Monday after the second Wednesday in December, all of the electors chosen as a result of the November General Election meet in their respective state capitals to cast two ballots – one for President and one for Vice President. In order to be elected, the candidates must receive 270 of the 535 electoral votes. If no candidate for President receives 270 votes, the House of Representatives chooses the winner from the top three vote getters. Each state has only one vote, regardless of its size. The Senate, however chooses the Vice President if no candidate receives 270 votes. All senators cast their votes as individuals, not as states.



## U.S. SENATE

### TERM OF OFFICE: SIX YEARS; NO TERM LIMIT

Each state elects two Senators. Senators share responsibility with Representatives for enactment of the nation's laws as provided for in the Constitution.

Candidates for the U.S. Senate were asked the following questions:

**BACKGROUND:** What are your qualifications for this office?

**HEALTH CARE:** What steps, if any, would you support to make a basic level of health care accessible, at an affordable cost, to U.S. residents?

**REPRODUCTIVE CHOICE:** What is your position on a woman's right to make reproductive choices? What is your position on U.S. contributions to the UN Population Fund (UNPFA)?

**ENVIRONMENT:** How do you think the U.S. should balance the competing goals of protecting the environment, ensuring adequate energy supplies, and reducing our dependence on imported oil?

## CONSTITUTION

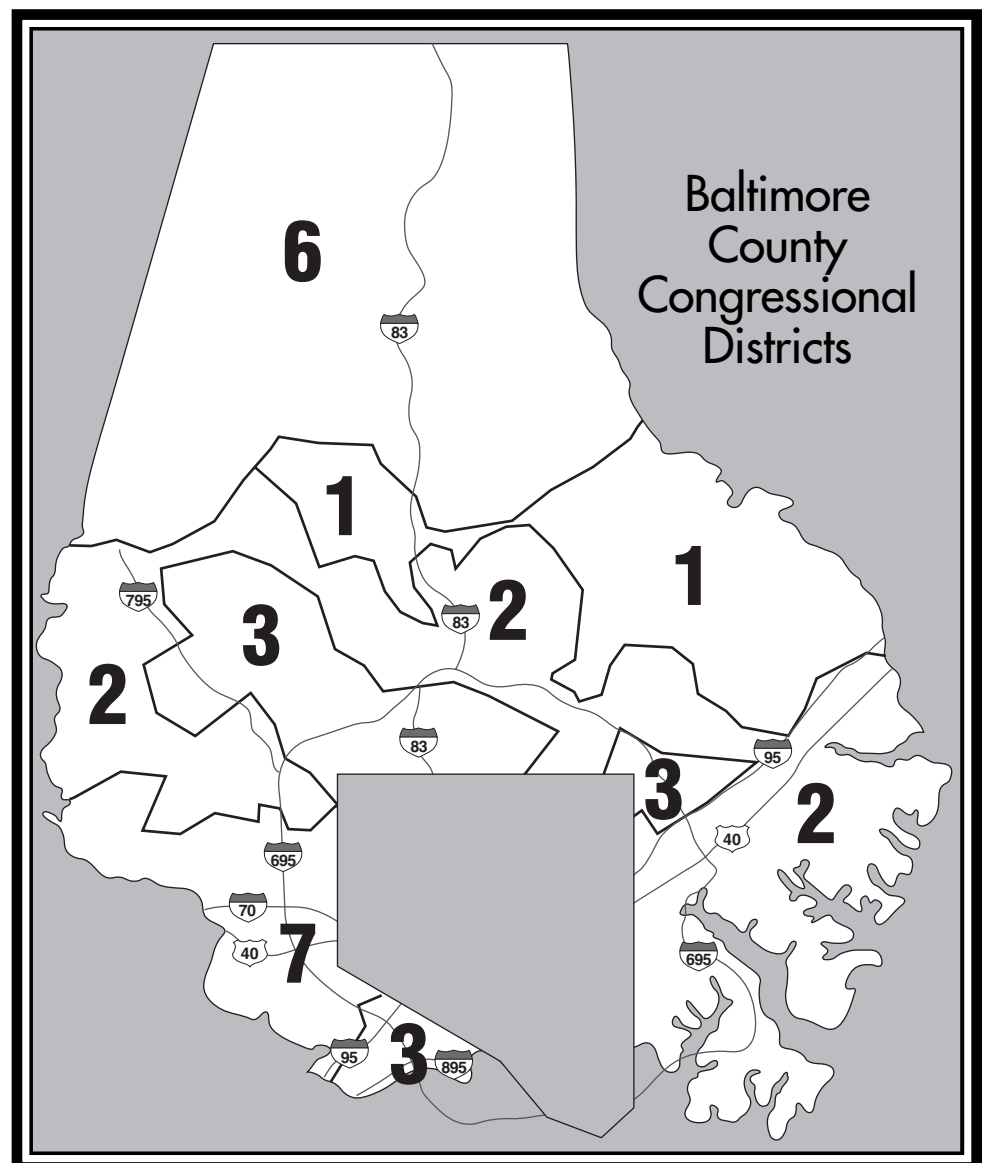
### Thomas Trump

Representatives share responsibility with Senators for enactment of the nation's laws as provided for in the U.S. Constitution.

#### **Wayne T. Gilchrest (incumbent)**

## Question A: School Borrowing

An Ordinance to authorize and empower Baltimore County, Maryland, to borrow \$78,661,000 for school projects to be undertaken in the ensuing fiscal years starting July 1, 2005, pursuant to Sections 705(a) and 718 of the Baltimore County Charter.

## Question B: Parks, Preservation and Greenways Borrowing

An Ordinance to authorize and empower Baltimore County, Maryland, to borrow \$5,550,000 for parks, preservation and greenways projects to be undertaken in the ensuing fiscal years starting July 1, 2005, pursuant to Sections 705(a) and 718 of the Baltimore County Charter.

## Question C: Public Works Borrowing

An Ordinance to authorize and empower Baltimore County, Maryland, to borrow \$79,385,000 for public works purposes, for the class of projects which includes among other things, streets and highways, bridges and storm drainage systems, to be undertaken in the ensuing fiscal years starting July 1, 2005, pursuant to Sections 705(a) and 718 of the Baltimore County Charter.

## Question D: Community and Economic Improvement Borrowing

An Ordinance to authorize and empower Baltimore County, Maryland, to borrow \$27,122,000 for public operational buildings including, but not limited to, general health, police, fire, recreation, libraries, senior center and detention buildings of facilities and necessary or desirable equipment, to be undertaken in the ensuing fiscal years starting July 1, 2005, pursuant to Sections 705(a) and 718 of the Baltimore County Charter.

## Question F: Refuse Disposal Borrowing

An Ordinance to authorize and empower Baltimore County, Maryland, to borrow \$1,710,000 for refuse disposal projects to be undertaken in the ensuing fiscal years starting July 1, 2005, pursuant to Sections 705(a) and 718 of the Baltimore County Charter.

## Question G: Community College Borrowing

An Ordinance to authorize and empower Baltimore County, Maryland, to borrow \$22,352,000 for community college projects to be undertaken in the ensuing fiscal years starting July 1, 2005, pursuant to Sections 705(a) and 718 of the Baltimore County Charter.

## Question H: Agricultural and Rural Land Preservation Borrowing

An Ordinance to authorize and empower Baltimore County, Maryland, to borrow \$3,777,000 for agricultural and rural land preservation projects to be undertaken in the ensuing fiscal years starting July 1, 2005, pursuant to Sections 705(a) and 718 of the Baltimore County Charter.

## Question I: Waterway Improvement Borrowing

An Ordinance to authorize and empower Baltimore County, Maryland, to borrow \$2,950,000 for waterway improvement projects to be undertaken in the ensuing fiscal years starting July 1, 2005, pursuant to Sections 705(a) and 718 of the Baltimore County Charter.
